
The June speaker is Norman Webb, a former school teacher whose topic is Beekeeping. He has hives situated in many country areas. He will also have honey to sell.



Retford Park Historical Home

Retford Park is located on Gundungurra Country and has а European history extending back to land grants made to Edward Riley Snr by Governor Macquarie in 1821. The grand house was built in 1887 by merchant and stockbreeder, Samuel Hordern and his wife Jane nee Booth, and designed by Sydney architect, Albert Bond.

In 1964, James Fairfax AC, former chairman of John Fairfax Ltd (later known as Fairfax Media), bought Retford Park and transformed the agricultural property into a gentleman's estate. Mr Fairfax was a well-known champion of the arts and generous philanthropist. He always believed that Retford Park should be preserved for the enjoyment and benefit of future generations and in 2016 he gifted his historic home and its magnificent gardens to the National Trust (NSW).

For 40 years Banana Cabana has been home to many monkeys retiring from Fauna Parks, Circus's, Research Facilities and private ownership.

We hope visitors to our Sanctuary will understand our residents may not be overly active, or looking quite as good as they did in their younger years, but they have done their bit in their former careers to educate and entertain us and can now sit back and enjoy retirement in a tranquil and peaceful environment.

At Banana Cabana we do not breed or trade animals, nor do we purposely seek to acquire monkeys of a different species to enhance our collection. Our monkeys stay with us for the rest of their lives, and we commit to providing the ultimate for each of them as an individual.

In consideration of our monkeys, we limit the days and times our Sanctuary accepts guests, and every guest is accompanied by a qualified keeper at all times.

Your support in visiting our Sanctuary is truly, sincerely, appreciated, and enables us to continue to care for our beautiful residents.

Visitors experience a fully escorted keeper tour and personal introduction to each of our residents. Keepers provide guests with information about each monkey's unique history, the natural history and current conservation status of the particular species and the extraordinary ethnoornithological connection human and non-human between primates. Visitors can hand feed some of the monkeys through the wire and are invited after the tour to relax with complementary light refreshments (tea/coffee/soft drinks/biscuits/scones etc.) overlooking the Sanctuary and gardens.

THURSDAY, 1ST AUGUST 2024

The Sydney Cricket Ground has been home to Australia's cricket since 1854. The Members Pavilion dates back to 1886 and has been used by the world's greatest cricketers such as Sir Donald Bradman and more recently Sachin Tendulkar and Steve Smith. The walking tour is a fascinating journey behind the scenes of the SCG and the SCG Museum. The precinct is Sydney's home of sport where international sporting heroes play cricket, rugby union, rugby league, football / soccer and AFL. Hear entertaining stories of players, spectators and events as you take in the sporting architecture and ambiance of the SCG.

Go behind the scenes of the Members Pavilion, changing rooms, walk onto the SCG field of play through the Members Pavilion and experience the SCG Museum, which holds Sir Donald Bradman's original bat and view the holographic light show. We will stand at the Members Long Bar and take in the Walk of Honour containing the names of 47 Australian sporting heroes. We will commence with morning tea at Moore Park before our 1.5 hour guided tour.

Afterwards we will travel to Paddington where we will enjoy a two course lunch with tea or coffee at Paddington RSL Club.

After lunch we will visit the Sydney Fish markets on Blackwattle Bay where we will have ample time to explore and an opportunity to buy fresh seafood to take home – eskys and ice will be provided for individual purchases.

Cost is \$100.00 per person and includes morning tea, SCG guided tour, two course lunch with coffee or tea and luxury coach transport. Departs at 8.45am and returns at approx. 5.00pm.

We will then continue on to Berrima via Burradoo and our Behind the Hedges Tour.

Day two will be Tulip time with our visit to Tulip Top Gardens which is run by the Rhodin Family. Acres of stunning world class gardens framed by weeping willows and 1000 blossoms, paints the scene for almost 1 million tulips, daffodils and other flowers creatively planted to create a blissful haven that is a must see. As you wander the gardens you will be mesmerized by the natural habitats of Tulip Top Gardens birds, frogs and more as well as enchanting music.
