General Business

President introduces Tony Lovett;

The Combined Probus Club of Belrose committee would like to increase the maximum numbers of members from 130 to 140 members. To achieve this increase in the shortest possible timeframe the club's constitution clause 3. (d) must be changed. Currently the clause reads –

"The maximum numbers of ordinary members shall be decided by members at an Annual General Meeting".

The above wording needs to be altered as follows to allow the club to proceed immediately. Probus South Pacific Ltd have recommended this wording change.

The change to the wording is as follows –

"The maximum numbers of ordinary members shall be decided by members at a General Meeting".

At the general meeting on the 14th of December 2023 the above wording change to the constitution will be put to all members in attendance to vote on. Should the vote to change the constitution be successful then a second vote to alter the Clubs Standing Resolutions item 4.1 to increase the maximum number of members from 130 to 140 will be put to all members present. The revised wording for this Standing Resolution 4.1 will read-

"The Maximum membership of the club shall be 140."

If this second vote is successful, then the club's maximum membership can be increased to 140. There was also a question of gender balance in the membership. The Standing Resolution 4.5 states the number of members of one gender, male or female, shall not exceed 60% of the maximum membership numbers.

Currently the club gender balance is 59% female and 41% male. With the current intake of members, the new balance will be 60% female and 40% male. With an increase in membership to 140 and using the clubs current Waiting List of prospective members the gender balance remains at 60% females and 40% male. Broadcast to follow.
