# **Obituaries**



For 40 years Banana Cabana has been home to many monkeys retiring from Fauna Parks, Circus's, Research Facilities and private ownership.

We hope visitors to our Sanctuary will understand our residents may not be overly active, or looking quite as good as they did in their younger years, but they have done their bit in their former careers to educate and entertain us and can now sit back and enjoy retirement in a tranquil and peaceful environment. At Banana Cabana we do not breed or trade animals, nor do we purposely seek to acquire monkeys of a different species to enhance our collection. Our monkeys stay with us for the rest of their lives, and we commit to providing the ultimate for each of them as individual.

In consideration of our monkeys, we limit the days and times our Sanctuary accepts guests, and every guest is accompanied by a qualified keeper at all times. Your support in visiting our Sanctuary is truly, sincerely, appreciated, and enables us to continue to care for our beautiful residents.

Visitors experience a fully escorted keeper tour and personal introduction to each of our residents. The Sydney Cricket Ground has been home to Australia's cricket since 1854. The Members Pavilion dates back to 1886 and has been used by the world's greatest cricketers such as Sir Donald Bradman and more recently Sachin Tendulkar and Steve Smith. The walking tour is a fascinating journey behind the scenes of the SCG and the SCG Museum. The precinct is Sydney's home of sport where international sporting heroes play cricket, rugby union, rugby league, football / soccer and AFL. We will then continue on to Berrima via Burradoo and our Behind the Hedges Tour.

Day two will be Tulip time with our visit to Tulip Top Gardens which is run by the Rhodin Family. # Sydney GPO Martin Place Sydney



Thursday 6th February 2025

Discover the rich history of the former Sydney General Post Office building with our resident guide on the GPO Heritage Tour.

The Sydney General Post Office (GPO) was constructed in two stages, beginning in 1866 and designed under the guidance of colonial architect James Barnet. It was regarded as a building which would come to symbolise Sydney in the same way the Houses of Parliament in Westminster represent London and the Eiffel Tower, Paris.

On September 1, 1874, the first stage of the GPO was opened, and Sydney was mesmerised by the first major building development in Sydney. In 1891, the clock tower was finally completed, and the bells rang out across Sydney for the first time.

Delve into the vibrant history and culture of Sydney's former GPO and let our resident tour guide bring you on a journey through time on the GPO Heritage Tour, to discover the stories, tales and legends of the city's iconic Grand Dame.

The Purified Recycled Water Discovery Centre is located next to the Quakers Hill Water Resource Recovery Facility (previously known as Wastewater Treatment Plant). Here, wastewater is tertiary treated before it is returned to the environment or enters the Discovery Centre.

The Discovery Centre opens to the community for tours in 2024.

What to wear and bring

You must wear sturdy, fully enclosed, flat soled shoes (no open toes shoes such as sandals, thongs, ballet flats, or heels). Long pants are preferred.

Safety glasses will be provided for a section of the tour, if you have your own you may wish to bring them.

Please bring a bottle of water with you. You can refill this on site. How to get there

# Murray River Cruise - Upper Murraylands 2024

Friday, 11th - Friday, 18th October, 2024

This delightful seven-night cruise takes you from Mannum to the upper Murraylands historical township of Morgan. ### FRIDAY

A late morning flight to Adelaide before we make our way to **Mannum**. Mid-afternoon the Murray Princess departs historic Mannum, and heads upriver while you enjoy a Welcome Dinner. As we cruise under floodlight to our overnight mooring at **Caurnamont**. You may see nocturnal wildlife on the riverbank. Watch for kangaroos, hairy-nosed wombats, tortoises, egrets, and many other species. Our on-board entertainer provides music for the night owls.

### SATURDAY

Daybreak and it's time for the keen photographers to be out to capture the special light and the morning movement of wildlife. Prolific birdlife includes pelicans, wrens, and swans. This morning, your discovery vessel awaits for a wildlife tour. Travelling in small, personalised groups, we explore the maze of the river and the birdlife is amazing. Watch for darters, herons and egrets feeding along the river's muddy edges. For those who choose to stay on-board, you may wish to partake in a game of bocce or compete in the fishing challenge before we cruise upriver past Walker Flat to **Sugar Shack Conservation Park**. In the afternoon, join us in the Sturt Dining Room for a special presentation on the bounty of food and wine produced in the Riverland. Tonight, sit back and enjoy being entertained by our on-board entertainer.

### **SUNDAY**

Continue cruising upriver this morning as we enjoy breakfast and pass through one of 13 locks which maintain the flow and levels of water. This morning enjoy some free time and, in the afternoon, join in the fun playing a few games of bingo. Late afternoon we secure the vessel at **Morgan** and after dinner, enjoy being entertained by our talented crew

### **MONDAY**

Today we are transferred by coach to the Riverland town of Waikerie and Banrock Station Wine and Wetland Centre near Kingston on Murray. 





# The 160X Bus

Not many people I speak to, know of the 160X bus, so I thought I should share some information with you.

The 160X is an express bus service which runs from Dee Why to Chatswood and in reverse. It runs very frequently and is a great way to get to and from Forestway Shopping Centre where you can connect with other buses. It runs about every 10 minutes most of the day with limited stops. From Chatswood it stops at Roseville Chase, Square then Forestway Jamieson Shopping Centre, taking only minutes. It then goes on to the Northern Beaches Hospital and limited stops to Dee Why.

At Chatswood you pick up the bus at Stand A which is only about 25 metres from where the traditional buses to the Forest area depart. Going to Chatswood you pick the bus up in Rabett Street just close to the usual Chatswood bus stop. I have just missed a Belrose bus at Chatswood (it now travels via Victoria Avenue) then caught the next 160X bus to Forestway Shops (it travels via Archer and Boundary Streets) and managed to beat the Belrose bus to Forestway where I have changed to it.
