

JULY MAGICAL MYSTERY \$2.50 OPAL CARD TOUR

Where did we go? Some clues to the mystery for you to solve: The name of our mystery destination is a corruption of the indigenous term apparently taken from the local Darkinjung Aboriginal people in 1789, and reputedly means 'big lagoon' or 'much water', referring to the deep tidal channel adjacent to the town centre. It was originally known by the white fellows as Webb's Flat, named for James Webb, the first European settler of the Brisbane Water region in 1823, and was first explored by a party led by Governor Arthur Phillip 1789 who called it by what he thought was its aboriginal name

A literary connection to this area is with Spike Milligan. Author, poet and in the 1950's a member of the radio Goon show. At our destination we can even walk to the Spike Milligan bridge.

After their emigration to Australia, our destination became the hometown of his parents and Spike Milligan became a frequent visitor to the town which he at one point described as the "world's only above-ground cemetery".

Now a royal connection;

Prince Charles had been a fan of the comic since Milligan's days on The Goon Show, an irreverent radio comedy show from the 1950s. The two first met when Charles became the Prince of Wales in 1969. They enjoyed a close

friendship over the years, despite Milligan's comical outbursts against the prince.

Spike did spend extended visits in Woy Woy and he loved the name. Woy Woy, he quipped, was its own sister town: "Woy, a town twinned with Woy". He wrote his comic novel Puckoon in 1961 during a stay in Woy Woy.

A few more of Spike's words of wisdom:

- "You can fool some of the people all of the time, and all the people some of the time, which is just long enough to be president of the United States." He said this some 50 years before Donald Trump became president.
- "Money couldn't buy friends, but you got a better class of enemy."
- "I have the body of an 18-yearold. I keep it in the fridge."
- "I'm a hero with coward's legs."
- "All I ask is the chance to prove that money can't make me happy."
- "The best cure for sea sickness is to sit under a tree."
- "I thought I'd begin by reading a poem by Shakespeare, but then I thought, why should I? He never reads any of mine."
- "How long was I in the army?
 Five foot eleven."
- "I turned and rubbed my hands with glee. I always keep a tin of glee handy."
- To the Scotsman "Is there anything worn under the kilt?
- No, it's all in perfect working order."

17 July - On a beautiful sunny day 14 of us set off on the 197 bus from the Belrose Supercentre to Gordon Station, then boarded a train to Hornsby and another train to our destination (Woy Woy) enjoying the bush and beautiful water views along the way.

On arrival in Woy Woy we visited a nearby community arts centre (our visit organised by Judee Radford) and were extremely impressed with the high quality of the art that we saw.









A short walk then to Fisherman's Wharf for a freshly cooked seafood lunch.









After lunch we crossed the road and visited Vinnies, then some went round the corner to a coffee shop for coffee and a chat, one walked to Spike Milligan Bridge and watched the seabirds there.



A few decided to take an early train home.

The Transport NSW website was invaluable in providing an itinerary for our journey, the trains were on time, comfortable, clean and quiet with plenty of information about when and where the train would arrive and where the train would stop next. We arrived back at Belrose just after 4pm.

TRADE TRAVEL

As mentioned at the July meeting I will be taking over the Tours part of the Tours and Outings position.

After looking at some options I have chosen to partner with Trade Travel. Trade Travel is a gold partner of Probus South Pacific. Their original operation was a wholesaler (developer) of tours and have expanded to the role of retailer as well as developer. They work with Probus Clubs to satisfy their travel requirements. I attended one of their "expos" earlier in the year and was impressed by the range of holiday options they provide access to.

Like our previous dealings with On Course Tours, Trade Travel offer a range of tours in different parts of Australia.

There are short and long tours on offer mainly between 5 days and 14 days. In addition to Trade Travel tours they can book tour offerings from other providers – such as train travel (think Indian Pacific etc and Heritage Train travel). They can also organise cruises and offer some of their own overseas travel options. The advantage of this is that we will all be able to arrange these options through our Probus Club. There is no financial kickback to the Club or to me.

While I might organise a tour especially for our Club – one or two each year – the advantage is that all members can access the tours on offer - firstly through me and then through the consultant looking after the tour. This can be done as a single, a couple or a small group. Your fellow travellers will most likely be members of other Probus Clubs – what a great way to meet like-minded people.

Trade Travel have a reward offer for people who travel on three or more tours – currently a rebate of \$100pp for the third and subsequent tours. When we book our own tour and we have at least 20 people there is a single financial return of \$500 to the travellers. This can be divided equally amongst the travellers or the most favoured option amongst Clubs is to put that money towards a bus to pick people up and take them to the starting point be that airport or other specific location.

As I see it, there are pros and cons to the arrangement, the pros being –

 Any member can organise a tour through me either for themselves or with a small group,

- We will have access to a different range of tours and all bus tours have a host.
- We can still have an arranged tour or two each year just for us (12 months to plan),
- Tour size is limited to between 20 and 30 travellers (not like my recent travel to the Melbourne Flower Show where there were 48 travellers),
- Tour cost is similar to other providers at around \$500 pp per day.

The main con that I can see is they do not offer a home pick up and return like On Course Tours. There is, however, an offset for group travel with the \$500 rebate as mentioned previously and a single boarding point for our own tour with a Sydney start. Another con is that their tours fill up quickly! I have personally booked a tour for Judy and myself in late September as a "test" of the Trade Travel experience and there were only two rooms available for that tour – now full.

A Trade Travel representative, Trish, will be the guest speaker at our September meeting and she will tell us about some of their tour experiences. There will be material for you to look at and ask questions. At the September or October meeting I will canvas you all to see if there is interest in having our own tour to an interesting new area from our presentation - likely October next year.














JULY WALK
