Thanks to our hard-working committee for making all these good things happen.




#### **BOOK CLUB**

"The Personal Librarian"

The book -historical fiction- is the story of Belle Da Costa Greene, the first librarian and Director appointed to the Morgan Library, by its wealthy founder J.P. Morgan in early 1900's, who was both a banker and founder of early American companies.

The problem was she was coloured and consequently would not have been appointed but she was fair enough to pass herself off as white and her skin colour she attributed to her fictitious Portuguese grandmother and altered her surname accordingly.

Her position included acquiring old books and manuscripts from pre 1500 and a number of Gutenberg Bibles at auctions. It necessitated many trips to London where often good deals were done pre-auction Her white identity came at a cost, having to distance herself from some of her family and the chance to marry and have children. It also meant she was alienated from her father, the first black graduate from Harvard who always promoted black rights.

The author Benedict is white and Murray African American and they depict the problems Belle had from both sides.

Generally all the members enjoyed it and interestingly the Morgan Library became public in 1924 and has just celebrated its centenary with an exhibition of Belle Da Costa Greene.


