Probus Opal cruise to Cockatoo Island in Sydney Harbour. The ferry travels west from Circular Quay to Cockatoo Island.

This replaces the mystery tour, and we expect there will be 4 opal trips each year. You are all welcome on this tour including those of us who are a bit wobbly as the ferries and island are wheelchair accessible.

On Cockatoo Island there is a café and toilets which are much improved since convict times.

The history of Cockatoo Island is about white convicts and gentlemen. Although there was an interesting woman involved in the island's history. However, as she was a woman she did not count much in Australian history. She was Mary Ann Bugg, 1834-1905, a noted Worimi woman. She helped her first husband Captain Thunderbolt escape from Cockatoo Island by swimming to Balmain. She taught the illiterate Thunderbolt to read. She helped provide food and shelter, spread

false information to help him stay ahead of the authorities and nursed him back to health after he was shot.

Mary Ann often referred to herself as the Captain's Lady and had 15 children by 4 "husbands", all white fellows.

Stuart or "Handsome Hobson" (as he called himself) or Stuey to us, was a kind and generous person who would not say a bad word about anyone.

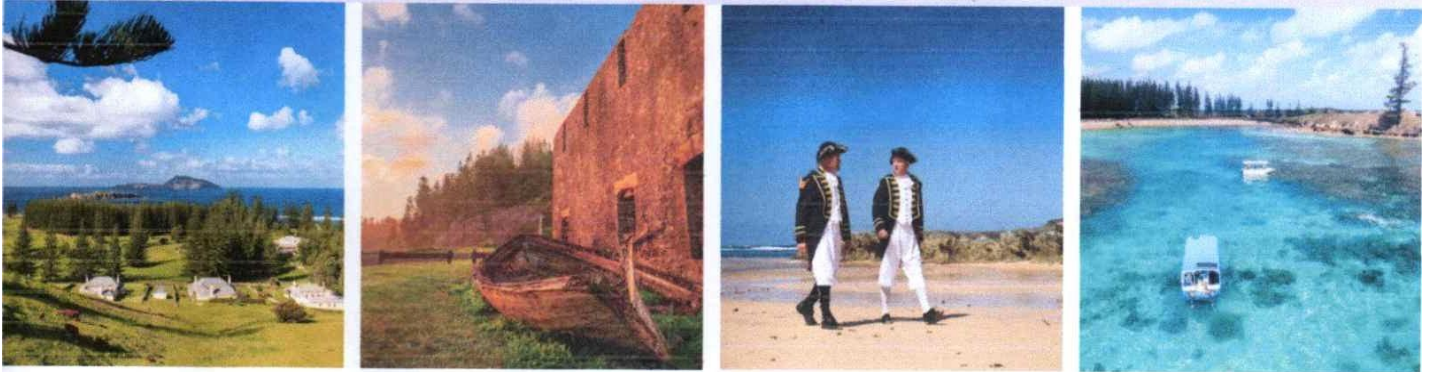
He was a very dear friend who will be missed by all of us.
